

Example of possible pathway through University Honors Program (UHP) curriculum for student taking 6 semesters to graduate (Advanced Entry 1)

ADVANCED ENTRY 1 = STUDENT BEGINS UHP WITH 30-59 CREDITS; MAY DROP 1 OF 4 HONORS ELECTIVES

Required CORE Courses for UHP

Required ELECTIVE courses for UHP (at least two [2] HONR 3700 classes are required)

Important notes:

- XXXX 15xx-H may be taken either fall or spring of first year, or possibly sophomore year.
- CTCM 2530-H may be taken spring of second year & is pre-requisite for HONR 3700.
- HONR 3700 may be taken after CTCM 2530-H is complete (minimum of two HONR 3700 are required), and HONR 3700 is not recommended the same semester as HONR 3791.
- A study abroad trip with at least 3 credits at the 3000- or 4000-level may count for one (1) HONR 3700.
- If completing dual honors, student may count one 3000 or 4000-level course in disciplinary honors (not a capstone course) as an HONR 3700 credit.
- At least one HONR 3700 must be taken before UHP Capstone sequence.
