ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to apply for AAHP, students must:

- Be an incoming freshman or sophomore in the first or second year of study
- Have a declared major in one of the five units of CoA+A
- Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5
- Be prepared to enroll in the 2-credit AAHP 2600: Introduction to Honors Seminar in the Spring semester of their first year

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Interested students should submit a 500-word essay, transcript, and letter
