What is the Pickering?

Up to \$84,000 for a graduate degree; job in U.S. Foreign Service after; for students interested in high-level foreign affairs

Who is eligible to apply?


U.S. citizen; senior seeking grad school; 3.2 GPA min.

Application involves:

Personal statement; statement of financial need; 2 recommendation letters

Process and Deadline:

No campus nomination required; deadline is **September 29**. Pickering applicants should also apply to the **Rangel Graduate Fellowship**, which is very similar.



What is the Truman?

Up to \$30,000 for graduate degree; leadership training; for students who want to be agents of change

Who is eligible to apply?

U.S. citizen; juniors intending grad school; must have strong academics, leadership, and service

Application involves:

Policy proposal; accounts of leadership, service, and academic accomplishment; 3 recommendation letters

Process and Deadline:

4 nominees per university; campus deadline of **December 15**, followed by nomination and national deadline in **February 2024**



What is the Udall?

\$7,000 and leadership training for motivated students interested in public service for the environment, or Native American affairs

Who is eligible to apply?

U.S. citizen, national, or permanent resident; sophomores and juniors; GPA should be strong

Application involves:

Short answer responses; an essay; 3 letters of recommendation

Process and Deadline:

8 nominees per university; campus deadline of **December 15**, followed by nomination and national deadline in **March 2024**
