ELIGIBILITY

- First-year, sophomore, or transfer students (less than 60 credit hours) in any major
 - Display academic rigor in current and previous coursework
 - Incoming first-year applicants must have a minimum 3.2 unweighted high school GPA
 - Current/Transfer students must have a minimum 3.4 cumulative GPA
 - Demonstrate strong commitment to the mission of the Honors College
 - Essay should fully address the topic and demonstrate fit with the University Honors Program
 - List of activities should display applicant's potential for success

The Business Honors Program (BHP) is a challenging plan of study designed to prepare you for your future. Our Business Honors students do more than excel in the classroom. They explore the world through study abroad and Charlotte through community service. They also investigate career paths through internships and cultivate connections through professional meetings with industry employers. Further, BHP students strengthen their leadership skills through engagement in University organizations.



Honors classes are kept small to facilitate faculty and student interaction. Upon completion of the program, you will graduate with an Honors in Business distinction.



You may join as an entering first-year student or as a rising sophomore or junior. If you can show academic excellence, demonstrated leadership and a commitment to community service, BHP may be for you.

PROGRAM BENEFITS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Priority consideration for honors scholarships
 - Students are expected to complete the array of offered honors courses by graduation
 - Members must complete a leadership experience and participate in an internship or study abroad trip
 - Maintain a cumulative 3.5 GPA
 - Access to honors housing in Levine Hall and priority registration for classes
 - Engage in numerous networking opportunities with business professionals in Charlotte
 - Additional BHP activities include: community service, social events and professional development events
 - Access to Honors College speakers and events

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to apply for AAHP, students must:

- Be an incoming student in the first or second year of study
 - Have been accepted into one of the five units of CoA+A
 - Have a minimum 3.4 cumulative GPA
 - Be prepared to enroll in the 2-credit AAHP 2600: Introduction to Honors Seminar in the Spring semester of their first year

- Continuing UNC Charlotte students with 60 or fewer credit hours should apply by the As Space Available deadline

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Students must complete 17 hours of honors coursework as follows:

**AAHP 2600: Arts + Architecture Honors Seminar
(3 credits)**

**Two Honors College elective courses
(3 credits each)**

**Two AAHP 370X Honors Seminars
(3 credits each)**

**AAHP 3900 Honors Thesis
(3 credits)**

Taken during the student’s final semester with a grade of “A”
