WHAT IS THE PROGRAM?

The Albert Engineering Leadership Scholars Program is a four-year, full-ride merit scholarship program housed in the Honors College. It is open to academically ambitious incoming first-year undergraduates intending to pursue a degree from the William States Lee College of Engineering and participate in the University Honors Program.

OPPORTUNITIES

Albert Scholars are actively engaged in multiple program activities in the Honors College, including individual development plans, specialized advising, workshops on undergraduate research and competitive fellowships, an annual book club, and more. They participate in the Engineering Leadership Academy in their second or third year.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Albert Scholars receive support for internships and study abroad, and often do research with outstanding faculty in state-of-the-art facilities in the William States Lee College of Engineering. They also complete a Senior Design project and have the option to pursue Honors in Engineering in addition to University Honors.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA or 3.8 weighted GPA
- Minimum 28 ACT or 1320 SAT (test scores optional through Fall 2024)
- List of activities
- Two essays
- Three letters of recommendation (2 academic, 1 leadership)
- Finalists will be interviewed

WHAT IS THE PROGRAM?

The Martin Scholars Program supports high-achieving Pelleligible students with unmet financial need. The merit scholar program is open to incoming first-year, transfer and continuing students in any major. Scholars will participate in one of UNC Charlotte's honors programs.

STUDY ABROAD & INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Martin Scholars are encouraged to participate in a study abroad experience and take advantage of internship opportunities to enhance their personal and professional development. Martin Scholars have studied abroad in London and Seoul and completed internships at Duke Energy, Lowe's Companies and the Congressional Internship Program.

- Eligible for Pell Grants
- Apply for FAFSA by Feb. 15
- Membership in a multi-year honors program
- North Carolina resident
- Preference to students from underrepresented groups

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

FIRST-YEAR & TRANSFER STUDENTS

- Minimum 3.7 unweighted GPA or 4.5 weighted GPA
- List of activities
- Two essays
- Two academic letters of recommendation
- U.S. citizen or permanent resident

CONTINUING STUDENTS

- Rising sophomore or junior at time of application
- Minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA
- List of activities
- Two essays
- Two academic letters of recommendation
- U.S. citizen or permanent resident

APPLICATION TIMELINE

- Applicants must complete and submit a FAFSA by Feb. 15
- Martin Scholars Program application deadline in the NinerScholars Portal: Dec. 1
- Apply to the honors program of your choice. Visit the Honors College website to learn more about the programs
- Notifications in March
- Finalists will be interviewed

SCHOLARSHIP FEATURES

- Equal to UNC Charlotte's in-state tuition and fees, renewable for three additional years
- Membership in a four-year honors program
- Receive support from the Honors College staff & faculty
- Access to honors housing in Levine Hall
- Priority registration for classes

ELIGIBILITY

All eligible applicants who apply to the Honors College by Feb. 1 will be considered for the Freeman or Johnson scholarship

- Open to all majors
- Demonstrated financial need as determined by the FAFSA
- Freeman Scholarship eligibility: Pell-eligible
- Johnson Scholarship eligibility: Financial need above Pell or other federal grant eligibility level
- First-year student, enrolled full-time
- Minimum unweighted high school GPA of 3.2
- Minimum 1200 on SAT or 22 on ACT (test scores optional through Fall 2024)
- Submit FAFSA by Feb. 15
- Join and remain a member in good standing of a 4-year honors program

APPLICATION TIMELINE

- Applicants must complete and submit a FAFSA by Feb. 15
- Apply to the Honors College by Dec. 1 to be considered for the Freeman or Johnson Scholarship
- Award notifications in March
