

Example of possible pathway through University Honors Program (UHP) curriculum for students taking 4 semesters to graduate (Advanced Entry 2)

ADVANCED ENTRY 2 = STUDENT BEGINS UHP WITH 60+ CREDITS; MAY DROP 2 (OF 4) HONORS ELECTIVES

*Only offered in Fall semester (for UHP interdisciplinary capstone)

May be taken in **either of these semesters, but **not both**

[^] Major/college honors capstone courses may be taken in last 2 semesters before graduation

Senior Honors Capstone courses vary for major/college honors; UHP = HONR 3790 (spng) & HONR 3791 (fall)

Required CORE Courses for UHP

Required ELECTIVE courses for UHP (at least two [2] HONR 3700 classes are required)

Important notes:

- Minimum of two HONR 3700 are required, and HONR 3700 is not recommended the same semester as the second semester of the honors capstone.
- Please note: **CTCM 2530 is the prerequisite** for HONR 3700 (& must be honors if taken at Charlotte)
- A study abroad trip with at least 3 credits at the 3000- or 4000-level may count for one (1) HONR 3700.
- If completing dual honors, students may count one 3000 or 4000-level course in disciplinary honors curriculum (but not a capstone course) as an HONR 3700 credit.
